President's Message

Hello Neighbors!

As we all know, the economy has not fully recovered. All of us know someone who has been laid off and is still looking for work. This economic down-turn has hit everyone, including our federal, state and local governments. Baltimore City is not immune from this reality. In fact, the mayor and City Council are working right now on ways to try to balance what is predicted to be a \$121 million budget deficit for 2011. In addition to cutting spending, the mayor and City Council are considering new or increased taxes and fees, including: hotel room tax; local income tax; elimination of the early payment discount for property taxes; energy tax rate; parking garage tax rate; parking fines; telecommunications tax rate; beverage container tax; bed capacity fee for college and university dorms and hospital beds.

The City predicts that the above-referenced measures could generate as much as \$40 million dollars for 2011.

The Civic Association is not a political organization and does not, and will not, take a position on these proposed taxes and fees. However, we will provide a forum for discussion of these important issues. Councilman Ed Reisinger is currently planning on attending our May meeting and we will also invite the Neighborhood Liaisons for the Mayor and the City Council President. At the May meeting, you will have an opportunity to ask questions and voice your opinion on these important issues.

Finally, as this is my last President's Message, I just wanted to share that it has been an honor to serve as the President of the Civic Association for the best neighborhood in the City. We are lucky to have a great group of people who are involved in the Civic Association and I wanted to thank them – as we all should – for their hard work, dedication and support.

Trash and Recycling:

Trash pick up is every Wednesday. Baltimore City law requires that all residences have durable trash cans with tight fitting lids. Residences are limited to two 96-gallon trash cans each. Trash must be put out in cans.

Recycling pick up is every Friday. There is no need to sort recyclables into separate bins and an unlimited amount of recyclables is allowed.

Acceptable recyclable materials include: •Plastics with any number from 1 to 7 on the bottom (Including wide-mouth plastic containers such as margarine, yogurt, sour cream containers, empty plastic prescription bottles, plastic drinking cups) •Rinsed milk and juice cartons •Empty aerosol cans •Glass jars and bottles •Aluminum, tin and steel food cans and foil •Mixed paper (all colors, mail, books (hardback, paperback and textbooks included), newsprint, folders, magazines, card - board, cereal boxes, phone books)

Unacceptable: •Plastic bags • Dry cleaning bags •Wire hangers •Chemicals or paint •Used paper napkins, towels, plates and tissues •Metallic wrapping paper •Non-bottle or jar glass, window glass •Used food containers and waxed- lined boxes •Foam or plastic packaging material •Motor oil containers, bottles and cans used for toxic substances.

Note about PLASTIC BAGS: Please reuse your plastic bags by donating them to the doggie bag bins in Latrobe Park.

Recycling Contest - Locust Point came in fifth out of 39 Baltimore communities that participated in the Cleaner Greener Baltimore Recycling contest. Jointly sponsored by the Department of Public Works and the Initiative for a Cleaner Greener Baltimore, the contest tracked recycling tonnage from the participating neighborhoods from January 1 through March 26. The results were announced at the Mayor's Spring Cleanup Kickoff, April 17. The goals of the competition were to increase community partnerships that promote a cleaner, greener city, increase household recycling through community outreach and education, and increase Baltimore's overall recycling tonnage. Thank you to everyone in Locust Point who recycled during this time. Let's keep up the good work!

Christ Church Rededicates Historic Sanctuary

Christ United Church of Christ (known by longtime residents as "the little German Church") will have a special service of rededication of the sanctuary on Sunday, May 2, at 3:00 p.m. The Locust Point community is invited and encouraged to attend.

The church's sanctuary was damaged by fire and smoke on Sunday, December 13. The fire started in the altar area when candles nearby set flowers on fire. No one was injured and the fire was extinguished within minutes. However, smoke damage was extensive, and the congregation has been worshiping in the Social Hall of the church since that date.

As a result of the fire, the sanctuary has been com-

pletely repainted, new carpeting installed, and the mural behind the altar restored by an art restoration expert. In addition, the congregation installed new flooring in the sanctuary and is in the process of purchasing new worship hymnals. The total cost to repair and restore the sanctuary was more than \$62,000. The church was built in 1887 and is a Baltimore historic site.
